WORLD CHORAL DAY: PLANNED DATE FOR 2020!

Following last year's decision by the IFCM Executive Committee, World Choral Day 2020 will take place on the second Sunday of December (**13 December 2020**). The World Choral Day event also provides the opportunity for choirs and choral events to join the celebrations anytime during the entire month of December. We

IFCM YOUTUBE PLAYLIST – VIRTUAL CHOIR PROJECTS

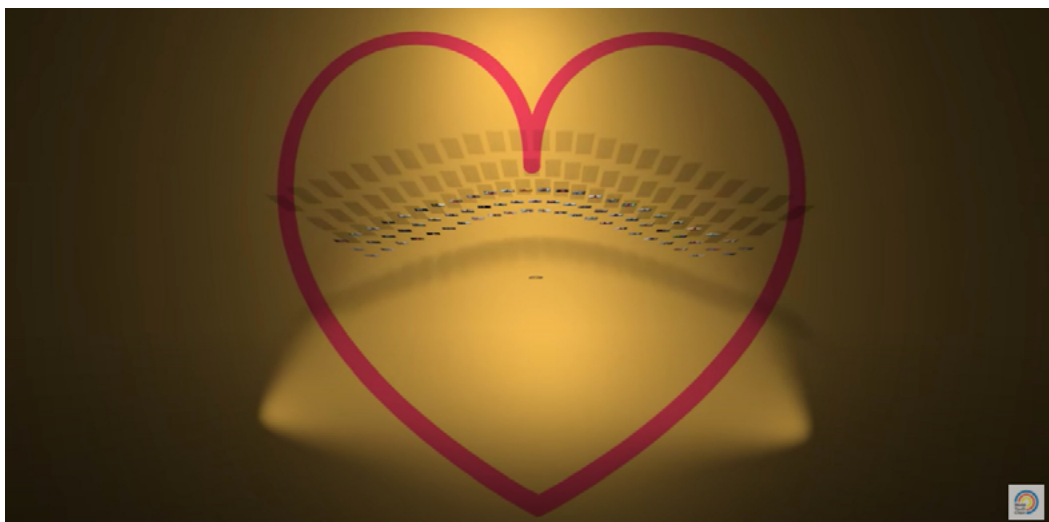

WORLD YOUTH CHOIR FOUNDATION

The [World Youth Choir Foundation](#) (WYCF) continues to add documentaries about former World Youth Choir sessions to its YouTube channel. Since the 2020 World Youth Choir session with the German National Youth Orchestra has been [cancelled](#) due to the coronavirus pandemic, the WYCF is featuring a documentary to mark the 10th anniversary of the [2010 World Youth Choir](#) in Spain. This ensemble consisted of 80 singers from 38 countries under the artistic direction of conductors Ragnar Rasmussen (Norway) and Josep Vila i Casañas (Spain). This documentary and other videos on the WYC [website](#) and the WYC [YouTube channel](#) are great promotional tools for encouraging singers to apply for future sessions. 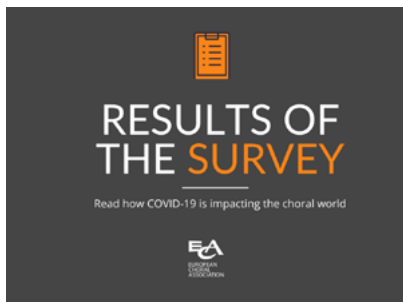

Webinar on The Intelligent Choir & Vocal Painting

The Intelligent Choir (TIC) is a philosophy and concept developed by Danish professor, Jim Daus Hjernøe. TIC refers to his musical philosophy and concept of training choir conductors which inspires and permits choristers to share responsibility for the musical process. The concept includes a pedagogical and artistic methodology using Vocal Painting (VOPA) signs and conducting as an instructional/conducting tool along with ear training, theory, vocal art, and improvisation.

Vocal Painting is an extensive collection of interactive hand signals designed to become a new language for vocal art and used to complement conventional conducting techniques of choral



music. It currently consists of 75 signals and more are in the making.

NEW ZEALAND STUDENTS CREATE SINGING BUBBLES

In the same week that the **New Zealand Choral Federation (NZCF)** and IFCM announced the cancellation of WSCM2020 (11-18 July 2020 in Auckland, NZ), NZCF also cancelled its major secondary schools choral festival, [The Big Sing](#). Each year, close to 10,000 young people from over 250 schools take part in The Big Sing regional festivals nationwide which culminate in The Big Sing Finale. As so many choral communities have done around the world, NZCF launched



a virtual choir project for the students to work on during the country's lockdown. Singing from their individual bubbles up and down the country, 180 secondary students joined their voices, and bubbles, to create extraordinary 'singing bubbles' floating over the islands. For 2020, The Big Sing became [The Virtual Sing](#) in the performance of an energetic waiata, [A te terakihi](#) (The Cicada).
