NEWS FROM WORLD SYMPOSIUM ON CHORAL MUSIC 2023

The first meeting of the World Symposium on Choral Music (WSCM) 2023 Organizing Committee was held on January 3, 2021. Composed of six International Federation for Choral Music (IFCM) representatives, six representatives from the [Qatar National Choral Association](#) (QNCA), and two honorary members, the team is set to work on the monumental and exciting task of bringing the WSCM to the Middle East region for the first time. To that end, the QNCA representatives are from Qatar and the Arab region. Qatar, with its ancient traditions of hospitality and contemporary global outlook, offers a unique and welcoming setting for voices from around the world to mix, mingle, and share their unique choral traditions and knowledge.



The WSCM2023 team is supported by two committees, Artistic and Administrative. The Artistic Committee is co-chaired by Giovanni Pasini (QNCA) and Jan Schumacher (IFCM Vice-President). It includes an additional four members: Cristian Grases (IFCM representative), Nasser Sahim Nasseb ([Qatar Philharmonic Orchestra](#)), Alena Pyne ([Sing Qatar](#)), and Beverly Shangkuan-Cheng (IFCM representative). In addition to this team, the Artistic Committee has nominated [Dana Alfardan](#), a Qatari composer and songwriter, as an Honorary Member. The committee is in the process of establishing a regional artistic advisory board to assist in the design of the Middle Eastern portion of the program. Together, these individuals will ensure that the very best of the world and the region is represented on the stages and at the podiums of the 2023 WSCM.

The Administrative Committee is delighted that Khalid Salim, Head of the [Qatari Ministry of Culture and Sports' Music Affairs Center](#), has accepted the title of Honorary Member in their team. The Ministry of Culture and Sports' active participation in the planning of this event offers very welcome resources and assistance in all aspects of this project. With Qatar's state-of-the-art facilities, global connectivity as the hub for Qatar Airways, and infrastructure legacy of the 2022 FIFA World Cup, participants in the 2023 WSCM can look forward to a seamlessly organized event that is easy to navigate and accessible to all.

Both Artistic and Administrative Committees have quickly settled down to work. Everyone is excited by the opportunities presented in this new location and looks forward to creating a WSCM like none held before. Watch for an announcement of the theme and the application timeline for choirs and lecturers in the coming months.

Mothers shine in JCA virtual Mothers Chorus Project

The Mothers Chorus Festival has been one of the most popular competitions held annually by Japan Choral Association (JCA). As the event was cancelled for 2020, JCA planned the first-ever virtual Mothers Chorus Project to keep the singing spirit alive. The

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result was a choir of 1,518 singers from all over Japan and the world! The [video](#) was released on 24 December 2020 and now it is available with English subtitles! Don't miss the opportunity to hear [JCA President and Vice-President](#) speak about the project and share comments from singers.

These were keys for making the project successful:

- Sheet music of the song **Sing!** was sent to singers for free with generous support by Kewpie Corporation.
- An instructional [video](#) and leaflet on how to record and post the videos was prepared.
- Sing-along guide videos for individual sections (soprano, mezzo-soprano, and alto) were made available.
- To encourage participation, video messages were created by choral musicians including the composer, conductor, pianist, and JCA executives.
- A video [recitation](#) by Shuntaro Tanikawa, the poet of *Sing!* was produced.
- The call for singers was made through various media: website of JCA and local associations, Social Networking Service (SNS), and Asahi Shimbun (major Japanese newspaper and a JCA sponsor).

Virtual Mothers Chorus was different from other virtual choir projects in that there were thousands of enthusiastic singers already looking forward to the live competition scheduled for summer 2020. From the opening moments of the video, you can see from the singers' shining expressions how much they were waiting for a moment to sing along with others. After being released, the video went viral within the choral community and was viewed 20,000 times in the first week.

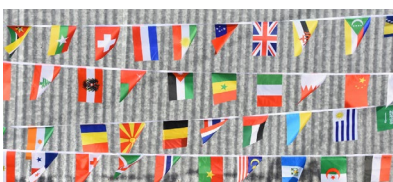
In the meantime, our organising team will keep an eye on all the guidelines for measures and do their best to ensure safe and appropriate conditions for every single part of the program.



MUSIC COMPETITION LAUNCHED TO RAISE AWARENESS OF CHILD LABOUR

The global [Music Against Child Labour Initiative](#) (MACLI) was launched in 2013 by the [International Labour Organization](#) (ILO), [Jeunesses Musicales International](#) (JMI), [International Federation of Musicians](#) (FIM), the Simon Bolivar Music Foundation "El Sistema", and a host of international music figures.

The Music Against Child Labour Initiative, which brings together musicians to raise awareness of child labour, has launched a **song competition** on 3 February 2021 to mark the UN International Year for the Elimination of Child Labour.

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Musicians can submit their competition entries to one of three categories: a global category for all artists; a grassroots category for music projects involving children affected by child labour; and a CLEAR Cotton project category for national competitions run in Burkina Faso, Mali, Pakistan, and Peru, where the ILO works with partners to combat child labour and forced labour in the cotton, textile, and garment value chains. Winners will be awarded a cash prize, a professional music-video recording of their song, and the opportunity for their song to be part of the global World Day Against Child Labour event in June 2021. The competition deadline is **12 April 2021**.
