Shenzhen Senior High School Lily Girls' Choir, conducted by Manxue Hu (China)

As a result of impressive performances with powerful impact and appeal, Shenzhen Senior High School Lily Girls' Choir has developed an international reputation in recent years. Founded in 1997, Lily Girls' Choir is comprised of girls (ages 11-17) from Shenzhen Senior High School. The choir has performed with many renowned conductors and symphony orchestras. Receiving awards at multiple international competitions, the choir won first prize in the Children's Choir category, as well as the audience award, at the 36th Tolosa International Choral Festival in Spain. Performance invitations for Lily Girls' Choir include ACDA Conference 2016 Eastern Division, IFCM World Choral EXPO 2015, and the John F. Kennedy Arts Center Millennium Stage.



Musica Nostra Female Choir, conducted by Zsuzsánna Mindszenty (Hungary)

Musica Nostra Female Choir was formed in 1994 with students in the Department of Music at the Eötvös Loránd University of Science where the choir is still hosted. Founded and conducted by Zsuzsánna Mindszenty, the primary aim of this female chorus is the high-quality interpretation and popularisation of early and contemporary music. Musica Nostra Female Choir has performed and recorded numerous world premieres and has produced five CDs which include music from different ages. Since its foundation, Musica Nostra has won prestigious awards at international competitions of the highest rank, including Arezzo (Italy),

Tours (France), Marktoberdorf (Germany), Maribor (Slovenia), Bad Ischl (Austria), Neuchatel (Switzerland), Bratislava (Slovakia), Namestovo (Slovakia), and Debrecen, Pécs, and Budapest (Hungary).



Shemesh Quartet (Mexico)

Founded in 2015 by singing undergraduates in the National Conservatory of Music, Shemesh Quartet is a vocal a cappella ensemble with a versatile repertoire that includes arrangements and original compositions by the members. Since its creation, Shemesh Quartet has received ovations from audiences and acclaim from peer reviewers in the choral world. Shemesh Quartet is an ensemble conducted equally by its members, creating a four-mind harmony. The ensemble has performed in New York City (Carnegie Hall and Lincoln Center) and in concert halls throughout Mexico.



Coro Juvenil do Instituto Gregoriano de Lisboa, conducted by Filipa Palhares (Portugal)

Coro Juvenil do Instituto Gregoriano de Lisboa was founded in 2015 by Filipa Palhares. Performing concerts on a regular basis, the choir participated in João Ripper's opera, Onehama, and Benjamin Britten's War Requiem with the Portuguese Symphony Orchestra. In the 28th and 29th Temporada de Música de São Roque, Coro Juvenil do Instituto Gregoriano de Lisboa produced two programs entirely dedicated to Portuguese contemporary composers, including several premieres. The choir won first prize in the 23rd Certamen Juvenil de Habaneras in Spain, gold medals in five editions of the Portuguese Summer Choral Festival, the silver medal in the champions category of the World Choir Games in South Africa (2018). In 2016, Coro Juvenil do Instituto Gregoriano de Lisboa released an album, *Mesmo que faça frio*, with music by the Portuguese composer, Nuno da Rocha.

A special component of the 2019 World Choral EXPO will be **EXchange!** - an intimate gathering of international scholars, performers, conductors, pedagogues, and composers to connect, create, share, and explore. In partnership with **The Singing Network**, selected papers and presentations will focus on foundations of choral music and diverse aspects of collective singing. Focus areas include: singing and song, moving, storytelling, conducting, dramatizing, mediating, teaching and learning, composing, socializing, imagining, communicating, expressing... and beyond!



WSCM2020: "A DAY AT THE SYMPOSIUM"

As Aotearoa heads at last into winter, the WSCM2020 team is thinking ahead to next winter and positively buzzing at the prospect of the international choral world descending on our little corner of the globe. And there's no doubt that eight riveting days of choral discovery, professional growth, and collegial aroha will keep us warm and utterly engaged in mid-July 2020! But what will a day at the Symposium actually look like? No one person's experience will be the same as another's, of course, but what might a typical day offer?



Fortuitously, a blog from next year by a WSCM2020 attendee has fallen through a hole in the space-time continuum and just been handed in. Here's an extract, reproduced without permission:

Woke up early on Symposium Day 3. Headed off for breakfast in the CBD, where again Aotea Square was packed with the 2000 or so delegates here for this choral extravaganza. Still buzzing at the memory of an amazing opening ceremony 2 nights ago – wow! Waited for my 'flat white' (strange name but great coffee) and went over my picks for the day on



the WSCM2020 event app. First up, attended Haka Fit session, followed by Open Singing – they're using a different choral celeb each day! After morning tea (in one of several great networking spaces), where I made some excellent choir touring connections, I went to American Joan Szymko's inspired talk on 'The Greening Power of Song', though others who went to Anna-Maria Hefele's overtone-singing demonstration were gobsmacked! Lunched at the Expo and caught up with Aussie choir director friends while browsing the publisher stalls – I could programme my next 5 years' concerts from what's available here! Crossed the square to the Concert Chamber for an excellent masterclass with Frank Havrø and Nordic Voices and just had time to squeeze in another thoughtful presentation: Jeremy Haneman's 'Singing Our Lives – A Haven for Migrants and Refugees'. Missed the multinational forum on 'Decolonising Choral Performance', grrr, but will look it up on the app. Then quickly back to the room before Town Hall evening concerts featuring the fabulous Batavia Madrigal Singers from Jakarta, the equally brilliant Zürich Singing Academy and to cap it all off Voz en Punto from Mexico – electrifying! Sleep needed. Tomorrow looks just as good.

Quite a day! Maybe that was from your blog next July...

If not, permission in writing must be obtained from the author or copyright holder of the text and must be enclosed with the entry form.

THE SHANGHAI COOPERATION ORGANIZATION COUNTRIES YOUTH CHOIR

Hohhot, Inner Mongolia, China, 24 June – 7 July 2019

IFCM, in cooperation with the [Shanghai Cooperation Organization](#) (SCO), is excited to announce the first SCO Countries' Youth Choir which will convene this summer in Hohhot, Inner Mongolia, China (June 24 – July 7, 2019). This special project hopes to bring 60-70 singers (ages 19-35) from the 18 countries comprising the SCO for an outstanding educational and social experience. The countries associated with the SCO network include eight member states (Kazakhstan, China, Russia, Kyrgyzstan, India, Pakistan, Tajikistan, Uzbekistan), four observer states (Afghanistan, Belarus, Iran, Mongolia), and six dialogue partners (Azerbaijan, Cambodia, Nepal, Armenia, Turkey and Sri Lanka).

Following a week of rehearsal with two internationally-renowned choral conductors, **André de Quadros** and **Maria Goundorina**, the SCO Countries' Youth Choir will perform at the SCO Countries' Choral Festival in Hohhot. During the choral festival, the choir will give concerts in Hohhot and surrounding cities. As well, there is a plan to perform in Beijing prior to the festival itself.



WORLD YOUTH CHOIR 2020

We are happy to announce that next year's session of the [World Youth Choir](#) will take place in **Bonn, Germany**, followed by a tour with concerts in Germany, the Netherlands, Austria, and Italy. This [session](#) will be organized within the context of the Beethoven Anniversary Year festivities, joining the National Youth Orchestra of Germany (Bundesjugendorchester) for a programme with Beethoven's *9th Symphony* and a commission work by Tan Dun entitled *Nine*.

Session dates: July 30 (day of arrival) to August 20 (day of departure), 2020

Artistic Team: Tan Dun (USA), composer of the commissioned work who will conduct the first concerts including the Gala concert in Bonn; Jörn Hinnerk Andresen (Denmark), conductor; and World Youth Choir Alumni as soloists.

The auditions material and information on the session will be sent to the national recruiters in **August 2019**, much earlier than in previous years. The three patrons of the WYC kindly ask you to join them again in their common efforts to reach and recruit as many great singers around the globe as possible. OBITUARY: EMERITUS PROFESSOR NKETIAH

Emeritus Professor Joseph Hanson Kwabena Nketiah, a renowned Ghanaian ethnomusicologist and composer, considered as Africa's premier musicologist, died at age 97 on March 13, 2019. Prof. Nketiah has over 200 publications and 80 musical compositions to his credit. He was the first African Director at the Institute of African Studies, University of Ghana, and received awards including the Cowell Award of the African Music Society, Companion of the Order of Star of Ghana, Grand Medal of the Government of Ghana, and the Africanist Award of the African Studies Association of the USA for lifelong devotion to African Studies.
