Musica International : End of a Huge Work on the Composers Table

The May 2025 IFCMeNEWS included a description of the benefits of using the database of 33,000 biographies of choral music composers. This resource has been developed by Musica International and is available at www.musicanet.org, or, with full privileged access, through the "SERVICE" section of www.ifcm.net if you are a member of IFCM: see <https://www.ifcm.net/news/1074/musica-international-----a-quick-way-to-find-information-about-composers-of-choral-music>. The database is, in fact, a table of composers connected to the more than 200,000 descriptions of choral scores of Musica International database.

An important milestone occurred in October 2025 - the re-examination and upgrading of this table was completed after a careful, one-by-one analysis of 33,000 records (several years of work)! This type of upgrading will continue and is never-ending. In the future, updates will occur through tracking news concerning the composers, e.g., every month, composers are passing away, and their record needs to be updated. As well, the database of scores is enriched almost daily as new records are added for composers not yet cited. While 25,000 records now have at least one external link to detailed biographies, links to new biographies need to be added and dead links need constantly to be removed and, if possible, replaced by others.

This is an appeal to every choral music lover to help us perpetuate and refine this work. Do not hesitate to use this database, to check the presence and correctness of the information about yourself (if you are a composer), to send us comments, and to give us information that is still not present in Musica. Contact us at librarian@musicanet.org. Musica is a collaborative project needing the participation of everybody.

Commissioned especially for this session, *Peace* was performed in renowned venues including the Palau de la Música in Barcelona and the *Théâtre Antique* in Vaison-la-Romaine.

Rooted in themes of connection and harmony, *Peace* reflects the spirit of the World Youth Choir—an ensemble that unites young singers from across the globe in a shared celebration of music and understanding.

European Choral Association (ECA)

Conductors Beyond Borders Peer-to-Peer Exchange Programme

Through a [Choral TIES project](#), a series of inspiring sessions have brought together conductors and choirs across borders, strengthening artistic and cultural connections worldwide. The programme has provided limited financial support to help cover travel expenses, enabling European conductors to collaborate with choirs from other continents, EU conductors to work in European countries outside the Union, or European choirs to host conductors from abroad.

A few words on the recent Peer-to-Peer CBB Session

[Oksana Sukhetska](#) (Ukraine) was invited by [Pro Coro Canada](#) (Edmonton, Alberta, Canada) to work with the choir (18-30 September 2025) under the guidance of Artistic Director Michael Zaugg and guest conductor Lone Larsen (Sweden). Together, they prepared a selection of choral works for the concert *From a Root a Flower Opens*, held on 28 September 2025, in Edmonton.

During her stay, Oksana took part in all rehearsals, workshops, and the concert itself. She studied and prepared the repertoire, worked closely with Lone and Michael on conducting techniques, both individually with the conductors and in front of the choir, and conducted a selection of a cappella pieces in the opening concert. Oksana also met with Ukrainian choirs and choral leaders in Edmonton, observed rehearsals, shared her own music and background, and became part of the local choral community. In addition, she had the opportunity to connect with other Canadian choirs and observe their work.
