### Meet the WSCM 2026 Composers

As part of the WSCM tradition, six WSCM 2026 invited choirs will be paired with six commissioned composers, culminating in world premieres at their gala concerts at the Macau Cultural Centre. Reflecting the symposium's theme, each choir will perform a newly created work by a composer from a different country, creating a dynamic space for cultural exchange and musical dialogue. Three commissioned composers are highlighted in this issue of the eNEWS and the other three composers will be featured in the July IFCMeNEWS.

#### Steve Ho (Canada)

Steve Ho is a multi-award-winning composer whose musical language integrates classical, popular, and cultural elements from his birthplace, Hong Kong. His compositions reflect a style deeply rooted in Cantonese expression within a global perspective. It is refined yet accessible, often conveying life-affirming messages. Steve has established a distinguished career in both film scoring and choral composition, receiving Best Original Film Score at the 21st Hong Kong Film Awards and the CASH Golden Sail Award for Most Performed Local Serious Work (2005). Most recently, he was awarded the Artistic Achievement Award at the 2025 World Choral Festival (Hong Kong), hosted by the World Youth and Children Choral Artists' Association (WYCCAA).





Steve Ho's note on ***Cantare amantis est – To sing is to love***

*Cantare amantis est – To sing is to love* is a celebratory work that extols the healing and restorative power of singing—a positive force that fosters connection and offers a sense of hope. This a cappella composition explores a wide spectrum of choral textures, from transparent to richly layered, from homophonic to contrapuntal, and from fluid rubato lines to irregular driving meters.



### **Çiğdem Aytepe (Türkiye)**

Çiğdem Aytepe is a choral conductor, composer, and educator who has played a formative role in developing generations of choral singers in Türkiye. Recognized for her impactful projects and collaborative works, she has been a faculty member at Hacettepe University Ankara State Conservatory since 2005. Since 2015, composition has taken on a growing role in Çiğdem's artistic practice. Writing primarily for amateur choirs, she focuses on balancing technical accessibility with musical depth. Works composed within this framework have received recognition in national competitions. Çiğdem also arranges Turkish folk songs, prioritizing the preservation of their natural, traditional structure. She views composition not merely as musical production, but as a space where cultural memory is sustained, bridging communities and traditions through intercultural dialogue.

### **Çiğdem Aytepe's note on *Shamans, Stars and Our Hearts***

As I think about the future, I find myself sinking deeper into the world's history filled with immense suffering. If humanity could truly descend to the deepest roots of its life-destroying actions, could these sufferings finally come to an end? As I worked with my images, translating them into music, the words of our time did not resonate with me. I was drawn to ancient word roots and fragments of syllables. And I was drawn to the idea of hiding the meaning, even keeping it pure. In my composition, there are shamans seeking knowledge from the stars, witnessing the agony of humanity. During the great meteor shower they have been waiting for, the knowledge flowing into their hearts says only this:

*listen and understand;  
the heart of the world  
the heart of the other  
your own heart*



### **Monika Sokaitė**

Monika Sokaitė is a contemporary music composer whose work encompasses instrumental, choral, and interdisciplinary music. Her music has been performed in Lithuania and across Europe by distinguished conductors, soloists, ensembles, choirs, and orchestras. Alongside her compositional activity, Monika is also active as a music critic and publicist. Feminist ideas occupy an important place in her artistic outlook, with her work often addressing questions of identity, corporeality, and women's visibility within contemporary music culture.

*"<...>Her musical language is jouissance crystallised into form: fetishistic aureoles as canon, Dantean harmony, and a persistent tension between technical restraint and an obsessive pursuit of text. A miniature for voice and piano or a celestial, architectural strike in the name of the Marquis de Sade – it makes no difference. The structure is the same: a self-perpetuating loop of desire. This loop turns within the sacred acoustics of the choir.<...>" — NIM*

Monika Sokaitė's note on ***La Divina Commedia. Paradiso. Canto I*** (based on Dante Alighieri) Inspired by the opening lines of Dante's *Paradiso*, the work explores light as a metaphor for human perception and the imagining of future realities beyond present understanding. Layered choral textures and fragmented imitation create a shifting acoustic space, recalling Dante's vision of light diffused throughout the universe. As the music unfolds, increasing density and rhythmic energy suggest an ascent beyond human limitations. The concept of *trasumanar*, transcending the human, gradually transforms the text from semantic meaning into sound, gesture, and pure sonic experience. Here, the future is understood not as prediction, but as transformation: a shift in consciousness through which new worlds become imaginable.

### Update on the IFCM Young Conductor's Virtual Mentorship Programme

The inaugural IFCM Young Conductors' Virtual Mentorship Programme has officially concluded after six months of artistic exchange, learning, and international collaboration.

Created by the IFCM YOUNG Committee, the programme connected emerging conductors from around the world with experienced choral leaders in a series of online mentorship sessions

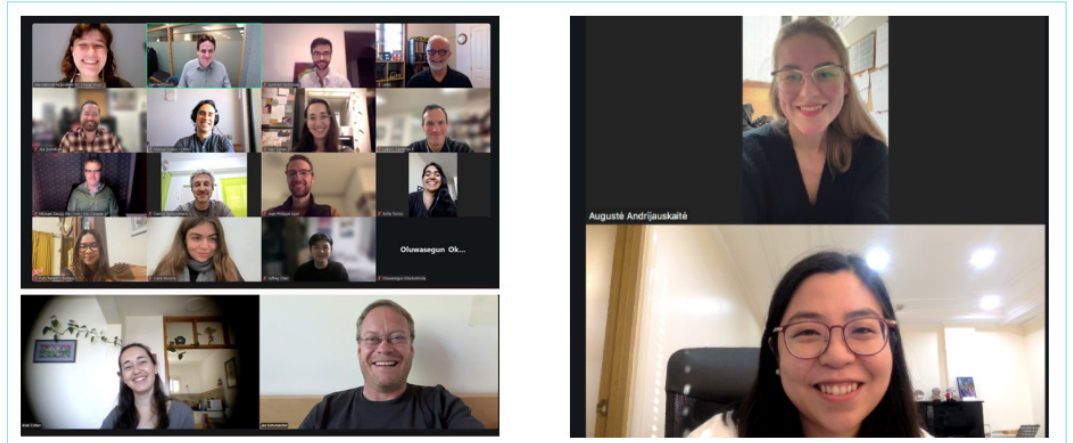


focused on artistic development, leadership, repertoire, and professional growth. The initiative aimed to foster meaningful cross-cultural connections through music while supporting the next generation of choral musicians.

The programme brought together an outstanding international group of mentors: Andrea Angelini (Italy), Beverly Shangkuan-Cheng (Philippines), Burak Onur Erdem (Türkiye), Cameron LaBarr (USA), Camilo Santostefano (Argentina), Jan Schumacher (Germany), John Rosser (New Zealand), Joseph Svendsen (USA), Manuel Suazo Pavez (Chile), Michael Zaugg (Canada/Switzerland), Rudolf de Beer (Norway/South Africa), and Friederike Stahmer (Germany).

Feedback from participants highlighted the programme's impact. One mentee described the experience as "truly inspiring", while another reflected that "sharing experiences across cultures has been a highlight, proving that both music and mentorship are universal languages that unite and enrich us."

The IFCM YOUNG Committee extends its sincere thanks to all mentors and mentees who helped make this project such a meaningful and successful initiative.



### **IFCM Welcomes a New Member in the National Organization Category**

#### **The Choral Culture Association (Koro Kültürü Derneği), Istanbul, Türkiye**

Founded in 2012, the [Choral Culture Association](#) is dedicated to developing, promoting, and sustaining choral culture in Türkiye. Driven by the belief in the unifying power of choral singing, the association builds bridges between choirs, conductors, composers, and singers, both nationally and internationally. Its flagship projects include the annual Choirs Marathon (Korolar Maratonu), held since 2013 to celebrate World Choral Day, and the hosting of the World Choral Music Symposium (WSCM) in Istanbul in 2023. In 2023, it also co-founded the Türkiye Youth Choir (Türkiye Gençlik Korusu) and continues to organize national auditions for the World Youth Choir and EuroChoir.



#### **Obituary: Tomaž Faganel**

The IFCM community is deeply saddened by the passing of Tomaž Faganel, renowned Slovenian musicologist, conductor, and music educator.

Tomaž devoted many years of service to the European Choral Association, serving as Board Member and Treasurer for nine years, and later continuing his commitment as Financial Auditor for many more years.

He also played an essential role for the IFCM in the organization of the European Symposium on Choral Music held in Ljubljana in July 1995. The symposium showcased the richness of European choral music, highlighted the diversity of singing traditions across the continent, and promoted Slovenia's cultural and choral heritage, which Tomaž valued so deeply.

From 1996 to 1999, Tomaž served as a member of the IFCM Board. Throughout his life, he remained a dedicated supporter of the international choral community.
