CONDUCTORS WITHOUT BORDERS

<u>Conductors without Borders</u> (CWB) is one of the most significant projects of IFCM. For the past 13 years, CWB has organized many professional development events in parts of the world where choral music education is still not available to everyone. There have been successful sessions in <u>Africa</u> and <u>Latin America</u>.

Following a review of the CWB project in early 2020, the IFCM board approved a new, improved structure which will expand CWB even more. The new structure provides a mechanism through which anyone can apply to organize a CWB project in their country and can even become one of the conductors.

If you are an organization, choir, cultural institution, or conductor and your country fulfills the following criteria, please consider applying for the CWB project:

- Local funding prospects
- · Choral singing interest and development
- Local partners (universities, choral organizations, institutions)
- Minimal number of potential participants (choral conductors/leaders/singers)
- Minimal local infrastructure (workshop facilities, accommodation facilities)

Approximately 200,000 scores are described in detail in Musica International, many including an image of the score, a sound-clip or a video, the text and its translation in different languages, and the pronunciation of the text by a native speaker. This extraordinary resource is ideal for developing a concert program according to a theme or purely for fun, by visiting the 'auditorium' and browsing through the 'favorite piece of the month' since 1998.


