HOPE & HEALING: WORLD CHORAL DAY 2021

On 12 December 2021, the second Sunday of December, the global choral community celebrated World Choral Day (WCD). Throughout the month, we saw many wonderful posts on social media as to how singing groups took part in the celebration. For several weeks before the celebration, IFCM posted videos of personalities in the choral music industry delivering the World Choral Day proclamation in their own languages. To date, we have translations of the proclamation in 35 languages, and we welcome additional translations in order to make our future celebrations even more inclusive.

As promised in our previous newsletter, each month the IFCMeNEWS will feature one or two of the choirs invited to the World Choral EXPO 2022.

INCANTARE, ARGENTINA

INTERNATIONAL FEDERATION CHORAL MUSIC

The female choir, Incantare, was founded in 2016 in Córdoba, Argentina, with Natalia Vadillo as conductor. Since its founding, the choir's repertoire and programming best illustrates its mission and artistic goals. The choir's first program featured Basque contemporary composers, followed by a second program of Argentinian folklore arranged by Cordovan composers. Repertoire from these two concerts comprised the programming for their first international tour (Uruguay, 2016). In 2017, Incantare performed *Los Juegos* (Argentinian folk rhythm songs) with music by Norberto Ambrós, lyrics by Hamlet Lima Quintana, and arranged by Carlos Alberto Flores. In 2018, they performed a Baltic music concert and the première performance in South America of *Misa Folk* by Laura Jekabsone. In 2019, Incantare presented *De pájaros y flores*, a concert dedicaded to composers from all times ranging from the Renaissance to the present. In 2020, they prepared the following concerts: *De Película* (pieces from films of all times), *Por Amor* (commissioned works composed or arranged especially for Incantare), *Canticum Novum* (sacred pieces from the 20th and 21st centuries), and *Concierto V Aniversario* (works by Basque contemporary composers).



AARHUS GIRLS CHOIR, DENMARK

Aarhus Girls Choir (Aarhus Pigekor) consists of 30 young female singers from Aarhus Music School (Aarhus, Denmark). Founded in the 1940s, the choir changed its name in 2002 to coincide with a shift in direction and goals, which included a higher musical ambition. Since then, Aarhus Girls Choir has toured internationally, including Europe, USA, South Africa, China, Argentina, and Canada. At home, the choir collaborates regularly with the Aarhus Symphony Orchestra and The Danish National Opera. During the past two decades, Aarhus Girls Choir has participated in numerous prestigious international choral competitions, winning gold medals and first prizes at International Choral Kathaumixw (Canada), Let the Peoples Sing (European Broadcast Union), and World Choir Games (Latvia and South Africa). Helle Høyer Vedel, a prominent and highly-acclaimed conductor in the Danish choral community, initiated the choir's change in mission in 2002. Under her leadership, the choir achieved its many successes at competitions while also performing at large events across Denmark, recording several CDs, and commissioning many pieces for the choir. The choir has enjoyed a long and significant collaboration with choreographer Panda van Proosdij, leading to the development of a special

focus on musical expression using movements to support musical ideas. In 2021, Birgitte Næslund Madsen became the conductor of Aarhus Girls Choir.

with unrestricted privileges to all the features of the menu. To visit the Auditorium, choose "Features", then "Auditorium" in the upper menu. Like everything in the MI project, this feature is collaborative. If you have audio files or videos that you think should be in MI database, please send a message to **librarian@musicanet.org**

You can, of course, also go directly to a given title by doing a search in the database. The present privileged access also allows you to do searches without any limitation in the database of about 200,000 choral scores or in the table of more than 33,000 composer biographies. MI is a powerful tool allowing you to build *a choral music program according to an idea or a theme by defining a series of criteria.*

Last month, members of the International Music Council gathered online for the organisation's 39th General Assembly during which they elected new leadership and adopted an ambitious work plan for the next two years. The IMC General Assembly also elected a new Executive Board composed of Roula Abou Baker (Lebanon), Charles Binam Bikoi (Cameroon), Dorothy Conaghan (Ireland), Paul Dujardin (Belgium), Ardavan Jafarian (Iran), Jacques Moreau (France), Charles Sanders (USA), Christine Thomassen (Norway), and Sheila Woodward (South Africa/USA).

Roula Abou Baker, IFCM Board member co-opted in 2020, was not only re-elected to the IMC Board but was also chosen to be one of the IMC Vice-Presidents. Here is what Roula has said about the appointment: *Being a Vice-President in the IMC board is definitely a big honor but I see it also as a big responsibility. Focusing on joining more Arab members to the IMC and IFCM is on the top of my priorities. In the Arab region, we need to believe more in the importance of networking, to connect more with the world, so we can promote our music and develop it. Congratulations and thank you Roula!*

NEWS FROM IFCM FOUNDING MEMBERS

LIVE NATIONAL CHORAL COMPETITION OF JAPAN CHORAL ASSOCIATION HELD SUCCESSFULLY!

The Japan Choral Association (JCA) is proud to announce that, for the first time in two years, its live National Choral Competition was held successfully. After winning the prefectural/ regional rounds, 133 choirs presented brilliant performances during the competition organized in October and November. In all, 1,222 choirs participated in the series of competitions: 72 primary schools, 497 junior high schools, 413 senior high schools, and 240 youth/university/ chamber/equal/mixed choirs. Since the live audience had to be limited this year, performances were also viewed online by 3,400 people.

To keep choirs alive even during the pandemic crisis, JCA developed a comprehensive guideline on choral activities to prevent Covid-19 infection, based on a scientific experiment of droplet release from singing supervised by medical experts. The successful 2021 competition was result of choirs being consistent in taking careful measure at every rehearsal according to the guidelines, cooperation by choirs with the competition organizers' policies, and countless initiatives taken by the Japanese choral community to support choral activities during the pandemic.
