
WORLD SYMPOSIUM ON CHORAL MUSIC (WSCM) IN ISTANBUL (25-30 April 2023)

Our original plans for this month's newsletter were quite different until life was interrupted suddenly and dramatically by two unfortunate earthquakes about 1000 km from İstanbul. More than 40,000 voices were muted under the rubble, and hundreds of thousands were left homeless. Having served as a historical bridge between various religious, culinary, and musical traditions for thousands of years, Antioch was almost completely erased from maps. We maintained high hopes throughout the retrieval process and cried out of joy with each miraculous rescue. We are deeply touched by the Mexican rescue dog Proteo dying on duty. All the world embraced our pain. We are grateful for the local and international aid, and we pray for all the victims of the devastating disaster.

The fault line moved the ground up to 3.5 metres to the west in the epicentre. We spent the month mourning, with concerts being cancelled and some choirs in the region hit by the earthquakes actually dissolving. Nevertheless, it was again music that brought us together. Our pain was alleviated by choral performances from friends abroad dedicated to the victims, and donations of huge amounts were collected during aid concerts in different parts of the world. We feel indebted to the support and solidarity of the international choral community.

Our efforts to revive keep us together in the preparations for WSCM in İstanbul. We have experienced the healing effect of choral music immediately after the catastrophe. We believe the solidarity in choral music will rejuvenate us further. Now there is another meaning attached to the WSCM 2023 theme on our side; *Changing Horizons* are possible as long as we stand together and sing together. We are looking forward to coming together in solidarity. See you in April in İstanbul.

This peaceful and ecological site, which boasts quality infrastructures, is the ideal setting for the 'festival village' with its lush green spaces preserving biodiversity and landscape heritage, as well as its multifunctional venues. All the workshops and most of the concerts will take place on site, close to the accommodation and restaurants, favouring exchanges and conviviality and, above all, quality performance spaces.

The largest international festival of choral music in Africa, initiated by the Confederation of African Choral Music (ACCM) under the patronage of the Ministry of Culture and Arts of Cameroon, Africa Cantat 2 is organised by the Association of Friends of the Madrigal Choir of René Esso of Cameroon, and supported by the IFCM, the European Choral Association, A Coeur Joie International (ACJI), Afrikiyo, and the Cameroon Federation of Choral Music A Coeur Joie (FECAMUSH-ACJ). MUSICA INTERNATIONAL

Manage your holdings directly in Musica International database

Do you have an extensive collection of choral scores? Do you manage easily to find your way around the collection? Do you have sufficient information on each piece in your current catalogue?

The good news is that you can use Musica International database, already rich with 200,000 references, to locate your own scores and benefit from a full academic description of each work at any time. The directories/folders (fields) you create will then be visible and available to you as well as to those authorized by you who use Musica.

How does it work?

Contact librarian@musicanet.org to get access to the 'private fields' function.

Find the record describing a score in your collection at www.musicanet.org.

Click 'Edit' and go to your 'Private Fields'.

Indicate in which section or on which shelf you wish to locate the score.

Repeat points 2 to 4 ad libitum.

The result: Without effort, you now have a catalogue of your scores manageable with all the functions of a professional database and overflowing with all the necessary information on each piece: composer, title, voicing, difficulty, genre, tonality, duration, keywords, multimedia features, etc.

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Furthermore, if a score from your collection is not referenced yet in the Music database, you can add the score's description to the database, thus contributing to development of Music International database worldwide.
