INTERNATIONAL STUDY TOUR TO THE LITHUANIAN SONG CELEBRATION, 2-7 JULY 2024

The Lithuanian Song and Dance Celebration is a national tradition of Lithuanian folk and amateur art. Once every few years, this cultural phenomenon culminates in a grand, national, weeklong Song Celebration which gathers tens of thousands of singers, dancers, visual artists, and spectators from all parts of Lithuania and the rest of the world. The final concert is called Song Day and features a choir of 12,000 voices. The tradition of the Baltic Song and Dance Celebrations is inscribed in the UNESCO Representative List of the Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity.

SWAN stands for Singing With Additional Needs and seeks to draw on best practices from different European countries to include people in collective singing who have additional needs due to disabilities and/or physical or psychological health issues.

The international jury meeting for the 2024 World Youth Choir session took place in Berlin, Germany, 12-15 January 2024. During these three days, the jury reviewed applications from over 160 candidates. After many hours of listening to the numerous recordings and evaluating the applicants, the jury chose 93 singers from 45 countries to be part of the 2024 World Youth Choir session. The rehearsal portion of the session will be held in Weikersheim, Germany, with a concert tour in Germany, The Netherlands, Italy, and Austria. <u>Musica International</u> regularly invites its users to help develop concert themes. The most recent theme is based on the words *planets*, *stars*, and *space*. A search for the keyword *planet* yields 122 pieces, while *space* and *cosmos* yield 126 and 402 pieces, respectively.

German composer Michael Ostrzyga found inspiration in this theme when he wrote *Laudate* eum omnes stellae lumin, Song of the Eclipse, Mond und Licht, Stern, luppiter, Saturn, Mars, Venus, Uranus and Mercurius.

A CŒUR JOIE INTERNATIONAL ANNOUNCES THE RESULTS OF THE COMPOSITION COMPETITION "CHANTER EN FRANÇAIS"

A Cœur Joie International is pleased to announce the results of its first composition competition "Chanter en français" (Singing in French).



Forty-eight scores were submitted from Belgium, Brazil, Cameroon, Canada, Democratic Republic of Congo, France, Italy, The Netherlands, Senegal, Spain, Switzerland, and Togo. The jury, which included Marie-Claude Remy (Belgium), Emmanuelle Pascal Falala (France), René Falquet (Switzerland), and Gautier Lemoine (France), was unable to award a 1st prize and decided to award a 2nd and 3rd prize.

The winners are:

- 2nd prize: Jean-Charles Côté (Canada), Mille regrets, texte by Jean-Lemaire (Belgium)
- 3rd prize: Pierre Laroche (France), La courbe de tes yeux, texte by Paul Eluard (France)


NEWS FROM CARUS-VERLAG

One of the most fascinating fragments in the history of music

The remnants of Mozart's *Requiem* serve to inspire! Since the composer's death in 1791, many attempts have been made to complete this great work in music history. The British composer and choral conductor Howard Arman has now published his own new complete version at Carus-Verlag, offering a fresh perspective on Mozart's masterpiece.
